I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:15 p.m. Those present were Alternate Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver, Deputy City Clerk Janet Harrell, and Deputy City Clerk Juanita Peterson.

II. APPLICATIONS TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSES

- City of Grand Junction dba Two Rivers Convention Center, 159 Main Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Hotel and Restaurant
 - Sheryl Thompson, Two Rivers Convention Center Event Operations Supervisor, was present to represent the applicant. The renewal for the City of Grand Junction dba Two Rivers Convention Center was found to be in order and approved.
- 2. Chipotle Mexican Grill, Inc. dba Chipotle Mexican Grill, 2504 Highway 6 & 50, Suite 300, Grand Junction, CO 81505, Hotel and Restaurant
 - No one was present to represent the applicant. The renewal for Chipotle Mexican Grill, Inc. dba Chipotle Mexican Grill was found to be in order and approved.
- 3. Grand FJ Japanese Restaurant, Inc. dba Sushi & Rok, 707 Horizon Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81506, Hotel and Restaurant
 - No one was present to represent the applicant. The renewal for Grand FJ Japanese Restaurant, Inc. dba Sushi & Rok was found to be in order and approved.

 - Terri Carter, Secretary for the applicant was present.

Alternate Hearing Officer Sam Starritt asked Ms. Carter if the patio is part of the Lodge's property. Ms. Carter said it is.

City Attorney Shaver concurred that the patio is part of the Lodge's legal premises and then explained how it was determined that a Needs and Desires Survey would not be required for this modification as the premises is self-contained. However, the applicant was asked to inform neighboring businesses of the pending application and to see if they had any objections to the licensed premises being extended. Ms. Carter said she went to the neighboring businesses and although she was unable to contact some, she was able to talk to three (Melrose Hotel, St. Regis Building, and Grassroots Cycles) and asked that they sign a letter expressing support of the Lodge's application (attached).

Alternate Hearing Officer Sam Starritt clarified the following: the patio is gated, staff will monitor the area to make sure alcohol does not leave the premises, and the Lodge's hours will remain the same.

The exhibits for modified and existing diagrams were entered into the record.

No one was present in opposition to the modification of premises.

The application for modification of premises for BPO Elks #575, dba Grand Junction Lodge No. 575 was found to be in order and approved.

City Attorney Shaver handed Ms. Kllanxhja three documents. Two with an "A" and the other with a "B" in the upper corners (attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kllanxhja if she was familiar with the documents. Ms. Kllanxhja said yes, she had completed them. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kllanxhja if this event had been held before. Ms. Kllanxhja said yes, the first event was held last year and then explained why the Foundation is requesting this ticketed event be allowed to serve alcohol and that identification would be checked by the alcohol vendors. Ms. Kllanxhja then reviewed the event diagram explaining where the entrance, exit, and vendors will be located.

Alternate Hearing Officer Starritt asked if there was anyone present in opposition of this Special Event. There was no one.

Alternate Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes 12-48-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event (it is a community event and fundraiser and will be held within a designated area within the Library), its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found the application for a Special Event Permit submitted by the Mesa County Public Library Foundation, PO Box 3668, Grand Junction, CO 81502 for "Table of Content" was in order and approved.




