Summary-

1/1 – Since the start of the new year there have been 9 suicidal subjects; 612 Starlight – 40 year old female parked her vehicle in a friends garage and died from carbon monoxide poisoning.

1/5 - 833 W Main Street – the GJPD was actively looking for one male subject, the subject was spotted driving a stolen vehicle and was followed to the Riverside area, the subject fled the vehicle on foot and broke in to a residence and barricaded himself, SWAT and IDT responded, subject eventually surrendered; 2322 Hwy 6 & 50 - Mobile City – a male subject called in to report his trailer was on fire, LE had contacted the male earlier and took a female from the address to Latimer House, there was no fire and the male was under the influence of drugs. 1/7 - 1035 Teller – 29 year old male asked his girlfriend to come to his house and as she walked into the residence the male shot himself inside his mouth, male was transported C3 to the hospital; Douglas Pass – Mesa County RAD assisted Garfield County SARC for a lost male in the area; Quincy's Bar – Code3 backup was requested for several subjects, two were taken into custody; 6th & Pitkin – a male

passenger fled on foot from a traffic stop, he dropped his backpack while running which contained a stolen gun and drugs, the male was a wanted subject but not located and the driver from the traffic stop was arrested.

1/8 – DeBeque – an 84 year old male subject who has dementia and is diabetic was reported missing since the day before, he was eventually found near the Winter Flats area.

1/9 – Grand Junction's first ever ICE STORM...aka CHAOS!

1/12 – Several crashes this morning and no ice on the roads; 656 Highland Drive – The SO was working on a missing person/possible kidnapping issue involving a divorce and questionable husband who was taken into custody during a high risk stop at 360 27 ½ Road, as SWAT was preparing to make entry into the Highland residence, an intoxicated female approached the area from down the street which was the missing female, SWAT still made entry into the residence and found a stolen vehicle on the property, Ace Towing was the next wrecker on rotation but was skipped due to the fact they may somehow be involved since the male subject involved was stopped and arrested at Ace Towing's tow yard.

1/16 – Bangs Canyon – Mesa County SARC was dispatched for two female subjects that were lost, a ground crew located the females, both had injuries including a rolled ankle and other broken bones.

1/17 – a female went in to labor in Garfield County and was being transported by a private vehicle to Grand Junction, the vehicle met up with Palisade Fire at Exit 42 and the baby was delivered in the ambulance prior to arriving at St. Mary's.

1/20 – Kmart on North Avenue – a glass break alarm was activated and responding LE found the front door to be broken, officers cleared the building and did not find anyone inside; 2464 Thunder Mountain Drive #1008 – a male victim reported two males and a female walked up behind him while he was walking his dog, the three subjects hit him in the head and then attempted to stab the male multiple times, the knife did not penetrate through the man's jacket and the subjects ran when a car passed by, the suspects were not immediately located; Westgate Inn – patient found to have overdosed, was in possession of Vicodin and alcohol; 166 Lyndhurst – a female reported being burglarized recently and the same male suspect now stole her car and purse, the PD was able to locate the suspect and arrested him without incident; 27 ½ Rd/27 ½ Court – rollover vehicle accident with one patient who sustained an injury to her shoulder.

 $1/21 - 1526658 \frac{1}{2}$ Road – a barn fire was reported with the structure fully engulfed and possibly filled with livestock and hay; A 47 year old male collapsed in the kitchen of a residence, the RP was unwilling to do CPR and the patient was found DOA by first responders; 431 Lark Drive – a female subject was threatening her husband with a butcher knife, he ran into the bedroom and she continued to stab the door several times, the female was taken in to custody and the male was evaluated and released by the squad on scene; Highway 65 – two

avalanches blocked the roadway in both directions, the second slide caught a truck and trailer occupied by five subjects, CDOT was able to get them out with no injuries: Mesa County SARC was dispatched to the Monument for two subjects who were able to self-rescue before help arrived; 402 E Grove Drive – a juvenile male was threating suicide with a gun and was taken to Mind Springs; Officers had to respond to all of CMU's registered parties over the weekend; Area of the College – multiple calls for intoxicated subjects going into the wrong houses; 553 Garfield Drive #1 - 50 plus subjects fighting in the street, reported that shots were fired, turned out to be fireworks and the fight dispersed when deputies arrived; A male subject picked up an intoxicated male and drove him to Haliburton because the intoxicated subject said he wanted to break in to the business, the male did actually break in and was taken in to custody by the GJPD; Highway 340 - avehicle failed to vield to CSP, SO was dispatched to assist, the vehicle finally stopped for CSP at mile marker 5 on Highway 340 and the driver was a 14 year old male who admitted to taking his grandfather's car; 29 Rd/Sandra Ave. - MCSO deputies came into contact with a mentally handicapped male who told deputies that his uncle had been doing drugs all night and the male felt like he was also high and wanted to be checked, the SO then made contact with the uncle at the Racquet Club apartment complex, who decided to jump from a 2nd floor balcony window while deputies were running his information, he was located outside of the building with a hurt ankle.

1/23 – One vehicle rollover with one patient ejected and transported C3, it was thought that there was another occupant, but Fire was only able to locate one; 15 year old stabbed in the upper chest/shoulder area, stated he was "jumped" in the ally at 7th and Orchard, did not have any suspect info; Waterdog Reservoir - one male and one female lost in the area, no injuries but were very cold; A juvenile female stole her mother's gun and left her residence claiming she was going to "jump" someone, she then posted suicidal comments on Facebook, her stepfather called later indicating she was still suicidal and her phone was pining to the area of 2889 C Road, the PD and SO arrived and remained at the location for an extended period of time trying to get the female to exit, shelter in place was issued for nearby residences and SWAT was dispatched, the house was gassed multiple times and two individuals were eventually taken into custody without further incident; 106 Cuttings Court – a intoxicated male left the residence last night and had not been seen since, he was later located on 25 Road and transported by his family; $387 \frac{1}{2}$ Skyler – a stolen vehicle was recovered, two females and one male were taken into custody; North Avenue Walmart – a suspicious male was reported waiting in the store near the entrance with a cart full of electronics and other items, a second male came in to the store and spoke with the male then left, the PD contacted the male inside and attempted to contact the male outside, a foot pursuit ensued with the male complying when held at taser point, the vehicle had false

plates, both subjects were taken to jail; Parkside Apartments – RP reported a suspicious male knocking on her door that would not respond when the RP asked what he needed, when deputies arrived three males ran from the location and one female drove away in a vehicle, the female was contacted at 2906 Sandra but would not respond to deputies, she eventually provided a fake name, but was later identified and had three warrants, a sword was found under her vehicle and it was not immediately determined if it belonged to her or was stolen, one of the males that fled the original scene was found at Peachtree True Value, tried to run again but was caught and arrested; Mind Springs – a suicidal male tried to hang himself in the doorway of his room, then tried to suffocate himself with a cushion, he was then transported to Community Hospital.

1/26 – Placer St. and Krista St. – elementary aged kids reported that an older male with a white beard, dirty white shirt, driving a rusted white van with mud on the bottom tried to lure them into his vehicle, the SO started an investigation; Baxter Pass area – a male called in a suspicious vehicle that was checked on the previous day as abandoned, there was female in the trunk who refused to come out for the RP, deputies responded and got her out of the trunk and returned her to her parent's house, the female had previously been reported as missing; Street Crimes units for PD and SO were actively looking for a vehicle that kept eluding, the suspects were known, with warrants and believed to be delivering drugs around town, because they were known to flee to an unknown address in the Parachute area, Garfield County and CSP were advised to use caution if they come into contact with the vehicle.

1/27 – 19 Road & L Road – a hazmat incident required the GJFD, Lower Valley Fire and CSP to respond.

1/28 - 433 South Avenue – a transient was squatting at a vacant house, slammed the door on a PD officer and then was taken in to custody without further incident; Hampton Inn Downtown – two males were seen knocking over trashcans and breaking windows with rocks, they were not immediately located; 536 Pauline – a sex assault on a three year old female was reported by St. Mary's Hospital staff; 1825 Orchard – homeowners asked for assistance from the PD to clear out a house party with over 100 guests; Kmart – C3 backup was requested by an officer for a trespasser, the subject was taken into custody without incident; 377 33 ½ Road – chimney fire was reported.

 $1/30 - C \frac{1}{2} \& 29 \text{ Road} - a 70 \text{ year old male was found DOA after crashing his vehicle into a pole at the intersection, it was believed to have been a medical issue that caused the death prior to the crash; 24 year old male accidently shot himself in the foot and was transported C2; 3155 Glendam Road – a male subject was reported peeking into windows and going door to door, he was contacted and taken in to custody; 29 Road/Walgreens – a blue Dodge Dakota was reported hitting cars in the parking lot with the male driver acting erratic, the driver was contacted,$

officers and paramedics checked the subject on the scene but was released to leave, he left the area, witnesses then saw him hit a pylon and median on 29 Road and Teller, drive up on the sidewalk, park on the sidewalk at his residence and run inside, outcome unknown; Orchard Mesa Maverik – an irate 45 year old male threatened to beat up the store clerk and asked where the clerk's "law enforcement buddies" were so he could shoot them, the male left and came back, circled the store in his silver Dodge pickup, the PD located the vehicle but did not contact because there was no probable cause, the same vehicle was later pulled over for a high risk stop, but the driver was a 19 year old male, original suspect never contacted; Avalon Theater – a neighbor that lives across the street from the theater was woken up by loud banging, the RP spotted a male kicking in the front doors and side glass doors of the theater, the male was taken into custody without incident; 970 E Aspen – a suicidal male took multiple pills and was at a house with three other people that he was restrained from, male was extremely uncooperative with LE, but was eventually arrested.

1/31 - Hall Ave & Normandy Way – the PD responded to a fight in the area, a suspect with a broken arm was taken to St. Mary's; 2907 ³/₄ Sandra Ave – SO responded for a male with 8 stab wounds and several other injuries, he was taken C3 to St. Mary's, the male was also involved in the fight at Normandy Way; multiple assaults, fights and trespasses came in at the same time as the stabbing; BURGI's occurred at 1437 Ouray Ave and 1353 N 21st St, both suspects were caught and taken to jail.
