

Summary

Meetings/events:

- Coordinator attended monthly meetings of Western Slope Volunteer Management Assn., DV Task Force and quarterly meeting of S.A.R.T
- Coordinator attended initial planning meeting for the formation of a Sexual Assault Prevention Academy at CMU in August.
- Coordinator met with Lisa Fenton Free from Rocky Mountain Health Foundation about their Medical Support Fund and the Daniels Rapid Response program. These programs may be of assistance to victims of crime or other tragedies, depending on criteria match.
- Coordinator and Public Safety Volunteer Coordinator Jeannie Lewis planned and participated in the annual volunteer appreciation dinner on 5/25/17 for all public safety volunteers. The three new victim advocates who completed training this past winter were also formally introduced and recognized for their efforts.

Training:

• Coordinator attended city-offered personal self-defense class, taught by Officer Keech.

Other:

- Coordinator assisted Professional Standards Unit with the roll-out of ArrestWatch, a new state-wide electronic messaging system which notifies a victim when an arrest has been made on a warrant. Coordinator attended nine briefings in May to clarify the new program and protocol implications for officers. The training bulletin was posted on SmartForce.
- Coordinator was paged to St. Mary's Hospital during the major critical incident training originating at the Grand Junction Regional Airport.
- Volunteer placed 58 follow-up calls to victims of inactivated property crimes (left messages for 38 of these welfare calls who did not answer)
