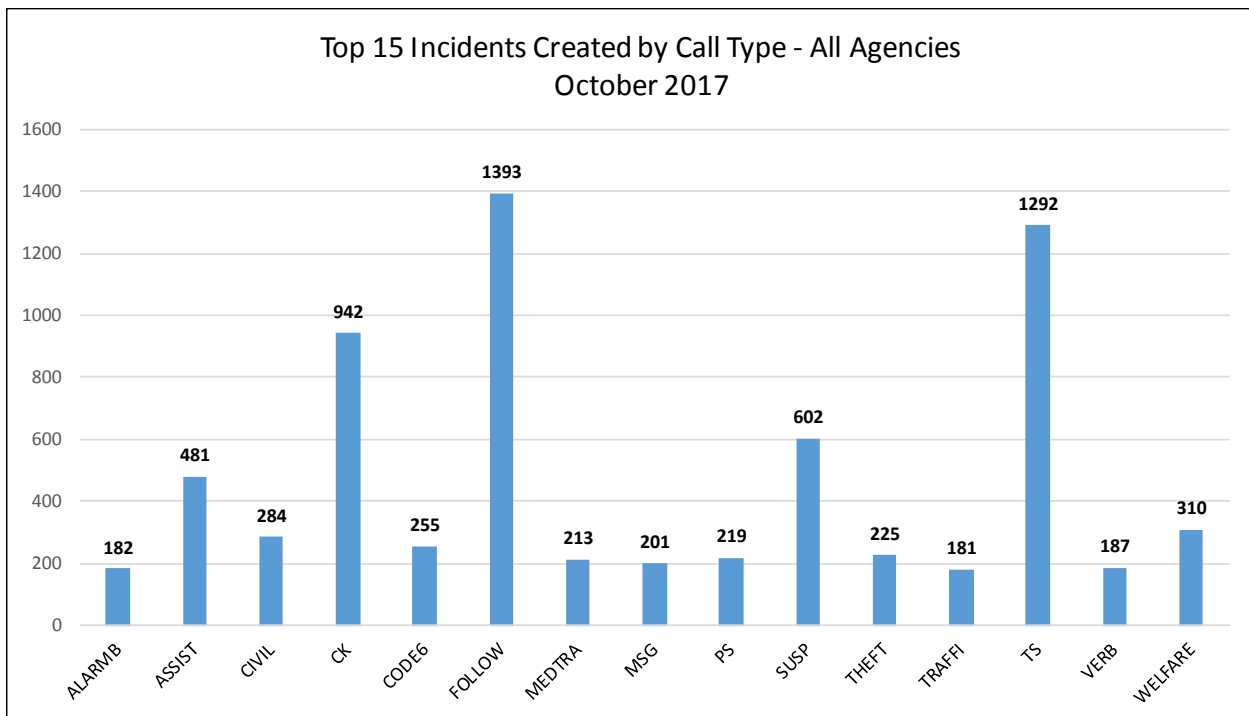

# Victim Services Program

## Summary

### Meetings/events:

- Coordinator attended quarterly LE coordinators' quarterly meeting held at Keystone during the COVA Conference.
- Coordinator presented overview of LE victim advocacy on a panel during the CMU SART training for its staff.

### Training:

- VAP monthly meeting acknowledged the graduation of five new VAP recruits, with Command Staff in attendance.
- Four volunteers (one on a COVA scholarship) attended the 3-day COVA Conference in Keystone & expressed gratitude for the learning experience.

### Other:

- Coordinator completed 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter grant assessment for VALE grant
- VAP Academy classroom training for five new VAPs was completed this month, and new graduates are currently shadowing more experienced VAPs after they are paged out.
- Volunteer placed 67 follow-up calls to victims of inactivated property crimes (left messages for 45 of these welfare calls who did not answer)
