The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Janet Harrell.





The guests will be asked to dump their remaining tequila out before the following tequila is tasted.
There will be Mexican food (Taco, Carne asada, chips, salsa, guacamole) served during the entire event.

Security will be identified by Fisher's Liquor Barn uniforms.

intoxicated will not be served more.



5. Describe the premises at which the event will take place.
The events take place on the front lawn area of the Western Colorado Botanical Gardens, south of Struther
Ave and at the south end of 7th street.
6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
We use 2 paid security personnel from CSI security. We have two to three volunteer security personnel
which are identified by wearing yellow vests with the word security in bold black letters on the backs.
7 What is the Control Plan for equiting at this great? (Head additional about if reconsor)
7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary)
We position one paid security person at the gate (the only entrance and exit) of the event from start to finish
The additional paid security person is positioned in the area where the alcohol is served and tickets are
purchased. The three volunteer security personnel are positioned at the following locations: 1.) (D check
and banding area 2.) behind the stage area 3.) front stage area. All possible issues observed will be
brought to my attention and dealt with accordingly with the paid security staff and myself.
8. How will security personnel be identified?
The paid security staff will be dressed in the CSI uniform and the voulnteer staff will wear a yellow vest
with the word security in bold black letters security on the back.
9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
There is a permanent six foot high steal fence surrounding the entire area of the gardens. There is only one
entrance and exit during the evnet, which is located at the east end of the garden area.



10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.) ID checks will be made by the TIPS trained volunteer staff as the patrons enter through a second gated area onto the front lawn. Wrist bands identifying who is 21 years and older will be applied after ID check is verified. Ticket sales for alcohol volunteers will check for bands before sale and servers will check as well. 11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom? All servers will monitor and report to me, I and the paid security staff will monitor and address issues. 12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages? Yes we have three TIPS trained volunteers. We also use the TIPS training information at each event for those people who are volunteering for the first time to educate them before each event. 13. What types of alternate beverages and food/snacks will be available? Water, soda and food truck certified by city and county. 14. 

None last year (2017) which was GJ Horizon Sunrise Rotary's first year operating the Beer Garden.

5. Describe the premises at which the event will take place.
Main Street in Grand Junction will be blocked off to vehicle traffic so the event can take place between
1st and 7th Streets. The Beer Garden will only occur between 3rd and 7th Streets.
6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
Two types of security will be used at the event, both will be paid. One group will man all entry/exit points.
Citidel Security Company, or a similar professional security entity, will parole the entire Beer Garden area.
7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary)
See the attached layout showing the extent of the Beer Garden and entry/exit points. All exit/entry points
will be monitored to ensure no beverages served in the Beer Garden leave the premises. Professional
security guards will parole the entire event and have radio access to 911 dispatch should police presence
be necessary.
8. How will security personnel be identified?
Professional security personnel will be in uniform. The gate security force will wear vests.
9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
Temporary pedestrian fencing will be used to secure the perimeter of the Beer Garden.
Orange construction fencing may also be used as needed. Signs will be posted stating that no alcohol is
allowed beyond the Beer Garden boundary.



10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.) All persons interested in purchasing alcohol will be asked for government-issued identification as required by state law. The use of wrist bands will identify those individuals who have proper identification proving they are of legal age to consume alcohol. 11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom? All paid security and volunteers will be able to identify the signs of intoxication such as: slurred speech, lack of coordination, dizziness, loss of balance, loud speech/yelling, falling, tripping, etc. 12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages? Yes, approximately 20 members of the Grand Junction Horizon Sunrise Rotary Club have taken and passed the City's Liquor Server Training. 13. What types of alternate beverages and food/snacks will be available? Food vendors, including restaurants on Main Street, will be present throughout the venue.
