U.S. POST OFFICE

Grand Junction's first permanent Federal Building was completed in 1918 providing much needed federal services such as the Post Office and court facilities. The expansion of federal and postal activities necessitated additions to the original building design in 1939 and again in 1965.

In 1972, the building was renamed the Wayne N. Aspinall Building after a former member of the House of Representatives for Colorado's Fourth District, and subsequently listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. With American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding, a 2010 rehabilitation project transformed the building into a net-zero energy facility certified as LEED Platinum.

The success of the modernization of the Wayne N. Aspinall Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse represents our responsibility to our environment and our commitment to excellence.
