THE DAILY SENTINEL, SENTINEL SQUARE


I.N. Bunting and Howard T. Lee began *The Daily Sentinel* at 537 Main Street and printed its first edition on November 20, 1893. Following Bunting's death in 1911, City Editor Walter Walker took the helm and then bought the paper in 1917.

In 1922, Walker built a new office and plant on this site, 634 Main Street, in a style that resembled many banks of the day, imposing and austere. The entryway was flanked by two lonic columns that opened to a stately lobby. Walker continued to be the owner and publisher until his death in 1956.

The Daily Sentinel remained at this site until a larger plant was built in 1970 at 734 South 7th Street.
