THE GRAND JUNCTION NEWS

Edwin C. Price and Darwin P. Kingsley founded Grand Junction's first newspaper, *The Grand Junction News*. The first issue was published on October 28, 1882, from a rough-cut log cabin located at what is now near 449 Main Street. The Daughters of the American Revolution, Mount Garfield Chapter, placed a bronze plaque at that location in 1957. *The News* relocated to a new two-story brick building at 558 Main and then again to its third and final location at 126 North 6th Street.

The Daily News, both a daily and weekly newspaper, and the building were bought out by their competitor, *The Daily Sentinel*, in 1924.
