Community Center Feasibility Study Final Update

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

A final update on the progress of the Community Center Feasibility Study will be presented. Guided by architects Perkins + Will, staff have been working with People for Local Activities & Community Enrichment (PLACE) to hold community and stakeholder meetings and conduct a statistically valid survey as a part of the feasibility process.

The public portion of the feasibility study included a series of community and stakeholder meetings conducted in January and March. The primary objectives of these meetings were to engage citizens in a variety of ways and solicit their input on community needs as they pertain to a community center. Attendance at these meetings was 350 participants.

A community survey was completed in March and April with strong participation. Postcards were mailed to a randomized group of City residents with 394 participating, which equates to approximately a +/- 4.9% margin of error. An open link survey was also created for those who did not receive an invitation to participate in the statistically valid survey. The open link survey received a total of 2,291 responses. The results of both surveys were very consistent with one another, so the focus moving forward will be on the statistically valid responses. Due to the extensive nature of the survey, results were provided to City Council in advance of the final presentation; however, the following is a summary of the significant findings:

• 88% of respondents stated it is somewhat or very important to develop a community

center.

- 79% responded favorably to support a sales tax increase for the construction and operation of a community center including potential improvements to the Orchard Mesa Middle School pool and gymnasium.
- A natatorium and fitness area were identified as the top two highest priority amenities, regardless of age. Other priority areas include gymnasium and community spaces.
- The survey offered four potential site locations with an opportunity to write in other suggested sites. A downtown location received the lowest overall rating, while Matchett Park was most preferred.

A base program was then developed based on the survey results and community feedback. The base program includes:

- Community Spaces Three multipurpose classrooms with divisible walls, gathering spaces for seniors, youth, and teens, bouldering wall, and catering kitchen.
- Aquatics Warm water leisure pool, pool party rooms, aquatic play feature, and all mechanical and storage.
- Gymnasium and Indoor Sports Space Two recreation hardwood courts and elevated running track
- Fitness Spaces Moderate fitness area, one group exercise studio, and storage/support.
- Support Areas Locker rooms, child watch, lobby areas, and staff areas.

Additional add-on amenities were also explored based on the positive results from the survey and include: renovation of portions of Orchard Mesa Middle School including the pool, gymnasium, multipurpose rooms, and one classroom building; addition of therapy pool and leasable tenant space; addition of third recreation gymnasium court and two racquetball courts; and upgrade of catering kitchen to commercial kitchen.

A major component of the feasibility study was the analysis of potential sites which included a comprehensive rating process (site matrix). The site matrix included three tiers of ratings, high priority, moderate priority, and lower priority, with 23 total criteria being analyzed. Criteria examples include site size; vehicular, bicycle, pedestrian, and public transit access; land cost; proximity to residential areas; future expansion potential; and compatibility with neighboring use. The site matrix suggests the following ratings:

#1 – Matchett Park

#2 – Lincoln Park

#3 – Downtown Grand Junction

#4 – 24 Road Corridor

The community participation process will conclude on July 17 with a final community

presentation to be held in the City Hall Auditorium from 11:30am – 12:30pm. This will be the community's opportunity to hear about the study's final conclusions and recommendations, as well as City Council's feedback from the workshop on July 16.

The presentation to City Council will include a summary of the community participation information reviewed in this report and the survey results already distributed to City Council. In addition, the presentation will include information regarding the site testing matrix, building program elements, site and building concepts, and an initial operations and maintenance estimate.

PLACE submitted a letter of intent to City Council on June 11 indicating their desire to place an item on the April 2019 ballot via a City referral. A follow-up memo from PLACE is included in this packet.

BACKGROUND OR DETAILED INFORMATION:

PLACE and Grand Junction Parks and Recreation have partnered on a study to examine the feasibility of a potential community center to be in Grand Junction. Following a public procurement process, a consulting team was selected from the Front Range. This team is made up of Perkins + Will (architects), Ballard-King & Associates (operational consulting firm) and Design Workshop (landscape architects). Collectively, these firms have extensive experience in the Rocky Mountain region and the Grand Junction area.

The feasibility study process began in January with a series of public meetings and stakeholder meetings targeted at specific user groups. The primary focus of these meetings was completion of a visioning process to determine community needs and priorities. Attendance at these meetings was very strong with over 200 participants. Follow up discussions were conducted in March with emphasis on refining the vision established in January with additional questions regarding specific amenities and site options. These meetings included a consolidated stakeholder meeting and two additional community meetings engaging an additional 150 participants. Recurring themes from these meetings included discussion on the current tax climate in Grand Junction, competition with private providers, site selection, affordable fees, multifunctional design for all ages, access for special needs users, etc. Stakeholders and community members also engaged in hands-on tasks including build-a-center and polling exercises. These exercises focused on user demographics, site priorities, building amenities, and optional satellite facilities.

A statistically valid survey was a major component of the overall study and was completed in March and April. Postcards were mailed to a randomized list of 4,500 City of Grand Junction residents. Participation was strong with 394 participating, which equates to approximately a +/- 4.9% margin of error. An open link survey was also available for those who did not receive a postcard invitation with 2,291 participants.

The results of both the invite and open surveys were very consistent with one another, so the focus moving forward will be on the statistically valid responses. The following is a summary of the findings:

- A broad cross-section of the community was represented in the survey results (location of residence, age cohorts, household compositions, and length of time in the community).
- City of Grand Junction recreation facilities are highly used and considered important. 79% of respondents who utilize private facilities use cardio/weights highlighting popularity with the community.
- Roughly two-thirds of respondents are not using local recreation facilities as frequently as they would like. Cost along with distance and accessibility were the top barriers followed by lack of facilities and amenities, crowding issues, and lack of awareness of programs/facilities.
- A majority of the community, 88%, stated it is somewhat or very important to develop a community center.
- Fitness opportunities and a natatorium were the most prioritized facilities to be included in the core community center, regardless of age.
- Households with children were particularly likely to support recreational swimming facilities (both indoor and outdoor).
- When respondents were asked to prioritize community center preferences on behalf of the Grand Junction community (rather than on behalf of their household), a natatorium rose to the top of the list for the community. Community spaces also became a higher priority.
- The highest share of respondents selected Matchett Park as a top choice for the site of the center. Preference for Matchett Park as a site location generally increased with age.
- Respondents were most likely to report that when considering the site of a new community center, it is important to have outdoor space for the future development of an outdoor pool/water park/splash pad, playground/shelters, and court sports.
- 79% responded favorably to support a sales tax increase for the construction and operation of a community center including potential improvements to the Orchard Mesa Middle School pool and gymnasium.
- There was near unanimous support, 95%, to fund respondents' top priority add-on (for an additional \$5 per year in taxes). Respondents were most in favor of additional aquatics (additional 4-lane 25-yeard lap pool, therapy pool, flowrider pool play feature).

The survey results, along with the public and stakeholder comments and feedback, were used to develop a base program for the facility which includes:

- Community Spaces Three multipurpose classrooms with divisible walls, gathering spaces for seniors, youth, and teens, bouldering wall, and catering kitchen.
- Aquatics Warm water leisure pool, pool party rooms, aquatic play feature, and all

mechanical and storage.

- Gymnasium and Indoor Sports Space Two recreation hardwood courts and elevated running track
- Fitness Spaces Moderate fitness area, one group exercise studio, and storage/support.
- Support Areas Locker rooms, child watch, lobby areas, and staff areas.

Additional add-on amenities were explored based on the overwhelming support from the survey. These add-on amenity packages include the following:

- 1. Renovation of portions of Orchard Mesa Middle School including the pool, gymnasium, multipurpose rooms, and one classroom building
- 2. Addition of therapy pool and leasable tenant space
- 3. Addition of third recreation gymnasium court and two racquetball courts
- 4. Upgrade of catering kitchen to commercial kitchen

A major component of the feasibility study was the analysis of potential sites. In addition to the survey data collected, a comprehensive rating process (site matrix) was completed to develop priorities. Six sites were identified early in the process including Matchett Park, Lincoln Park, a downtown location, a 24 Road Corridor location, the location of the previous Grand Junction Athletic Club (on Patterson Road east of 25 Road), and Orchard Mesa Elementary School. The building footprint and site development required a minimum of 8-10 acres for development, so the previous Grand Junction Athletic Club location and Orchard Mesa Middle School were eliminated from the survey questioning and further consideration. The site matrix included three tiers of ratings, high priority, moderate priority, and lower priority, with 23 total criteria being analyzed. Criteria examples include site size; vehicular, bicycle, pedestrian, and public transit access; land cost; proximity to residential areas; future expansion potential; and compatibility with neighboring use. The site matrix suggests the following ratings:

#1 – Matchett Park

#2 – Lincoln Park

#3 – Downtown Grand Junction

#4 – 24 Road Corridor

A hard copy of the site matrix will be provided to Council as part of the presentation on July 16.

As a final step in the community participation process, a meeting will be held in the City Hall Auditorium on July 17 from 11:30am – 12:30pm. The community will have the opportunity to hear about the study's final conclusions and recommendations, as well as City Council's feedback from the workshop on July 16.

The presentation to City Council will include a summary of the community participation process and the survey results already distributed to City Council. In addition, the presentation will include information regarding the site testing matrix, building program elements, site and building concepts, and an initial operations and maintenance estimate.

PLACE submitted a letter of intent to City Council on June 11 indicating their desire to place an item on the April 2019 ballot via a City referral; therefore, discussions regarding this opportunity are anticipated. A follow-up memo from PLACE is included in this packet.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The community center feasibility study process was funded by a \$25,000 planning grant from DOLA and \$25,000 in matching funds from PLACE. Fiscal information regarding the estimates for operations, maintenance, and construction of the potential community center will be discussed and included in the presentation.

Construction estimates for the base facility are \$38.6 million and include infrastructure and site development costs for Matchett Park as the preferred site location. Cost estimates for the additional add-on options are as follows:

- 1. Renovation of portions of Orchard Mesa Middle School including the pool, gymnasium, multipurpose rooms, and one classroom building; \$2.5 million
- 2. Addition of therapy pool and leasable tenant space, \$2.8 million
- 3. Addition of third recreation gymnasium court and two racquetball courts, \$5.9 million
- 4. Upgrade of catering kitchen to commercial kitchen, \$1.9 million

SUGGESTED ACTION:

Staff and members of PLACE are seeking input from City Council on next steps.

People for Local Activities & Community Enrichment (PLACE) is a grassroots, volunteer effort by citizens to reignite and re-imagine how a Community & Recreation Center could benefit Grand Junction.


To further that cause, PLACE secured a grant from the Colorado Health Foundation and financial support from the Rocky Mountain Health Foundation to contribute \$25,000 toward a study that comprised the foundation for a matching Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) grant. PLACE was pleased to partner with the City of Grand Junction's Parks & Recreation Department to conduct a feasibility study to examine the possibilities and challenges around location, operations, funding, amenities, partnerships, community input and architecture for a Community & Recreation Center unique to our city. We are very excited to present the recommendations this month!

Our community has continued to show overwhelming excitement for a Community & Recreation Center. PLACE will urge City Council to allow the people to speak – to show exactly how many citizens want a community center by voting in an April 2019 city election.

While the professional consultants, Perkins+Will, summarize the results from months of public meetings, multiple focus groups, two surveys, and a thorough operational analysis, PLACE also wanted to share highlights from our grant report that outlines the continued efforts and enthusiasm within our community since the feasibility study was launched:

- PLACE attended 35 community events to engage with citizens.
- PLACE has obtained more than 3,500 signatures of support!
- PLACE coordinated or was involved in at least 37 meetings with community leaders and opinion makers to discuss their ideas, concerns and input about a community center.
- GJCommunityCenter on Facebook has grown to more than 1,300 followers and enjoys weekly engagement from the community.
- Apart from our PLACE core strategic planning team, the PLACE database has doubled and nearly 50
 people have signed up for significant volunteer commitments.

PLACE will continue to listen to the voices of citizens and share priorities for a unique Community & Recreation Center. This grassroots commitment and enthusiasm is what will make this effort successful. PLACE looks forward to April 2019, when we hope to finally see a vote that truly guages the support in Grand Junction for our own Community & Recreation Center!

Paper surveys were also available upon request.

METHODOLOGY


- Registered Voters List purchased from Mesa included renters and homeowners
- Included only residents of Grand Junction for the Invitation Survey
- 4,500 surveys mailed to a random sample of City of Grand Junction residents in March, 2018
- Final response to the Invitation Survey: 394
- Margin of error: +/- 4.9 percentage points
- 2,291 surveys completed through the Open Link
- Included primarily residents of GJ but responses from out-of-town respondents also

The written analysis and discussion to follow will focus primarily on the statistically-valid invitation sample, but responses from each sample are graphed side-by-side and sample differences are discussed throughout this report. In addition, selected results are segmented by presence of children in the household (yes or no), whether the respondent is registered to vote in the City of Grand Junction, and respondent age group (under 34, 35-64, 65+). For those analyses, invitation and open link samples have been grouped together and then segmented, thus providing the most robust sample size for analysis.



About one-third of invitation respondents live in ZIP 81501. The open link sample is comprised of proportionately more respondents living south of the Colorado River.




Q1. What is the ZIP code of your residence?







The average household size is 2.6 for the invitation sample and 2.9 for the open link sample.






Open link sample households are more likely to have children within the 6-12 age range (28% vs. 13%), as well as children in the 13-18 age range (24% vs. 10%).




Q6. How long have you lived in the City of Grand Junction?









Q25. Please indicate your gender: ; Q26. Are you a registered voter in the City of Grand Junction?









Do you and/or members of your household belong to any private club facilities?




Q10. Do you and/or members of your household belong to any private health clubs/fitness/golf facilities?




ACTIVITY PARTICIPATION AT PRIVATE FACILITIES

What recreational or fitness activities do you and your household participate in most frequently at your private club facilities?


























Q14. In your opinion, how important is it to develop a new community center in the Grand Junction area?

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











































