PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS,

the first ten Amendments to the Constitution of the United States of America, known collectively as the Bill of Rights, were ratified on December 15, 1791; and

WHEREAS,

the Bill of Rights is the foundation of American liberty; securing our most fundamental rights including the freedom to speak, assemble and practice our faith; and

WHEREAS,

to preserve the rights and freedoms secured by the Bill of Rights, our forefathers and hundreds of thousands of men and women in succeeding generations have sacrificed, suffered and died; and

WHEREAS,

the rights and freedoms guaranteed by the Bill of Rights deserve perpetual celebrations; the sacrifices made to protect the Bill of Rights deserve eternal remembrance; and

WHEREAS,

ratification of the U.S. Constitution in most states depended upon the adoption of the Bill of Rights. The 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, ratified in 1868, extended the federal Bill of Rights to citizens under state law; and

WHEREAS,

to commemorate the Bill of Rights with a special day honors the fundamental rights it enshrines and the sacrifices made to create and preserve these rights, and proclaims these rights to the citizens of this City, to this County, to this Nation and to the World.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Barbara Traylor Smith, Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, do hereby proclaim December 15, 2018, as

"BILL OF RIGHTS DAY"

in the City of Grand Junction.
