AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE CITY OFGGRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO.

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of July, 1979 hearing was held before the City Council of the City of Grand Junction to determine the eligibility for annexation to the City of thenterritory nereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, after said hearing, the City Council determined that said territory was eligible for annexation, that all of the requirements of the Municipal Annexation Act of 1965 and been met, and that no election was required under the terms of said Act;

Beginning at a point thirty feet North of the Southwest Corner of the Southeast one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter, Section 1, Township 1 South, Range 1 West, Ute Meridian; thence North 630 feet; thence East 1295 feet to the West line of 27 1/2 Road; thence South along said West line 630 feet; thence West to the point of beginning. All in Mesa County, Colorado. (Known as Treehaven Subdivision, From 274 Road on the West to 272 Road on the East, Patterson Road on the South extending 660 feet North.)

De, and the same is hereby, annexed to the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.
