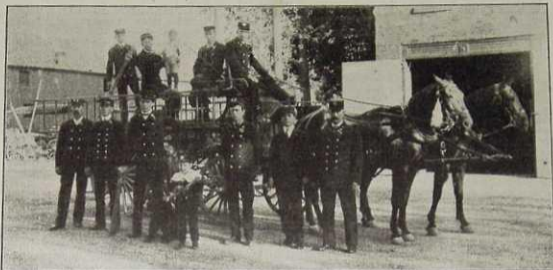


THE GRAND JUNCTION FIRE DEPARTMENT
