## CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO MINUTES OF FIREMEN'S PENSION BOARD MEETING JULY 27, 1964

A meeting of the Firemen's Pension Board was held in the City Hall Conference Room, July 27, 1964. Present were Joe Lacy, Jack Schmidt, Orville Hannigan, William Manchester, Helen Tomlinson and Gerald Ashby.

A discussion was held concerning a letter from attorneys of Mr. Hoyt Brown advising Mr. Brown not to travel to Denver for a medical examination that had been requested by the Pension Board. An appointment had been arranged for July 30, 1964 with Dr. Charles Rymer for an examination of Mr. Brown.

A notion was made by Jack Schmidt and seconded by Orville Hannigan as follows:

1. "Mr. Brown should be paid in full for the month of July.

2. Mr. Brown should make arrangements to be present in Denver f July 30, 1964 for his examination. If Mr. Brown prefers the Pension Fund will pay an amount equal to the cost of Mr. Brown's travel to Denver plus Dr. Rymers Denver office charge towards the cost of an examination in Grand Junction. (The doctor to be acceptable to the board). All costs above this amount to be borne by Mr. Brown.


3. The pension paid Mr. Brown shall terminate August 1, 1964 until such an examination is made. Further payment to be decided by the board as a result of the examination."

The motion was approved by Ex unanimous vote.

It was mentioned that no further word on the study by **D**eferred Compensation Administration Inc. has been received.

A motion for adjournment was made by Helen Tomlinson and seconded by Wm Manchester.
