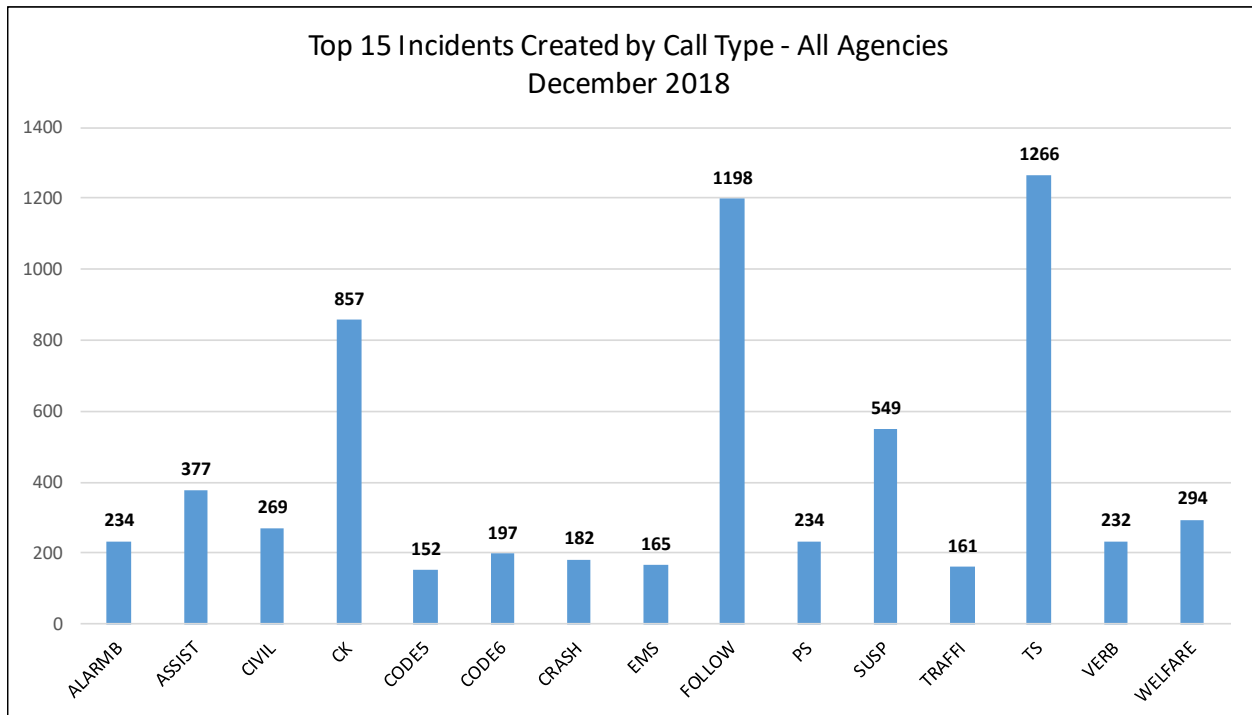

Department review

Use of force

12/6/2018 2019-00002 Officer was dispatched to a locate of a possible runaway and made contact with a subject matching the description. Subject gave false information as to his name and was found to have two warrants. When the officer attempted to arrest him, the subject ran from the officer. The officer deployed his taser, however, the probes did not penetrate or make contact with the subject. Subject became exhausted and laid down on his own and was taken into custody.

12/14/2018 2019-00005 Officers responded to an address of a suspect with probable cause for 1st Deg Trespass. The suspect came to the front door, but would not step outside, but was advised he was under arrest. An officer grabbed the suspect's arm and he began to pull away and run into the house and an officer followed him. The officer and the suspect fell off the back porch area about a foot to the ground. Suspect injured his knee when he landed on the ground.

12/1/2018 2018-00144 Email received: On 12-01-2018 Officer Gonzalez was involved in the City's Parade of Lights and was walking with his K9 when he jumped and handled a juvenile problem in front of Brown's Shoes. A summary of the incident was that two juvenile females who were in the care of the RP (Ashley Crimm) were supposed to go home with the RP and were refusing to leave the downtown area with her. The RP was also unable to contact the mother of the juveniles and get permission to leave the kids at the parade. To add to the incident, both juveniles were also picking on the RP daughter. Officer Gonzales was able to speak with the two juvenile and explained to them they were in the care of the RP and needed to listen to her because she was responsible for their welfare. The females called their grandmother who, in turn, told both of them they needed to listen to the RP and leave with her as requested. The RP later called into dispatch to complement Officer Gonzales on his professionalism, how well he spoke with the girls, an how he allowed the kids to interact with his K9 partner as a tool to build rapport and gain cooperation. RP was nothing but impressed and thankful with Officer Gonzales and his efforts.
