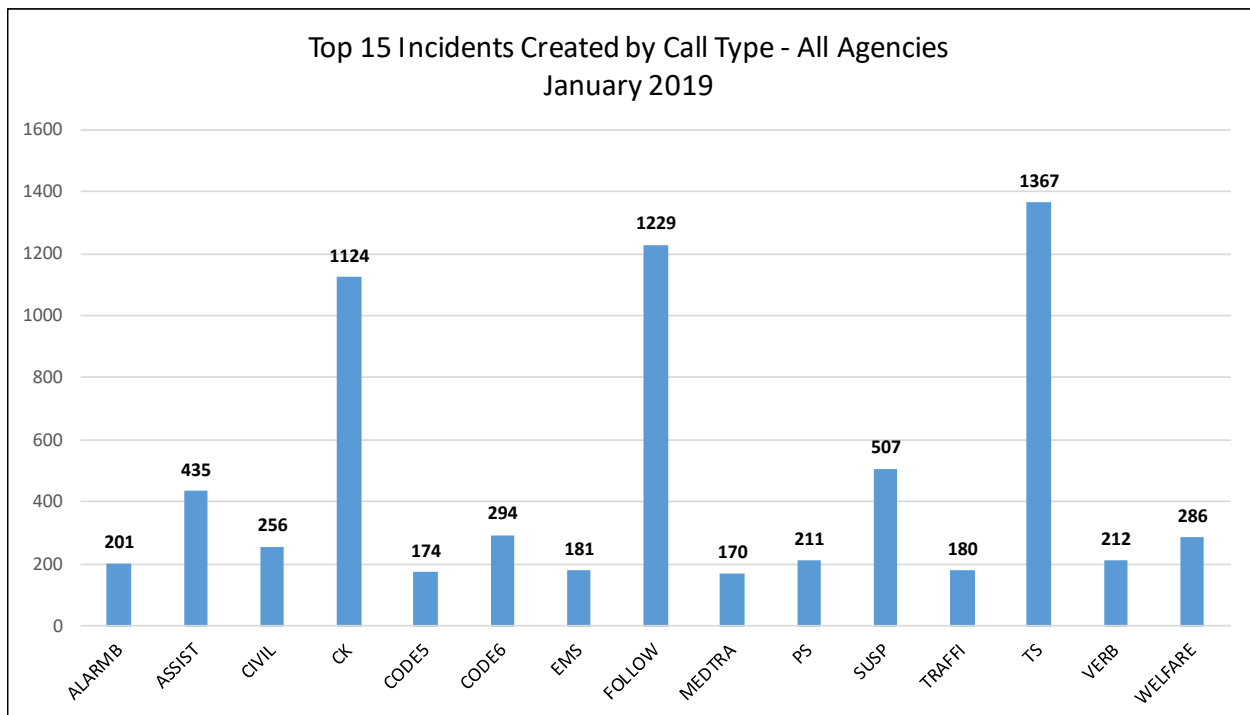

Use of force

1/11/2019 2019-00007 Officers responded to a report of an assault in progress. Once on scene they contacted the suspect, who was intoxicated and uncooperative. The suspect attempted to lunge at the officers and pushed back into a recliner, yet he attempted to get up and kick at officers. Officer performed a cross face maneuver to suspect to get him to stay in the chair and calm down. Once released from that, the suspect's nose began to bleed. He was treated by medical personnel.

Employee 1 Followed policy *RTR followed policy*

1/24/2019 2019-00009 Officers dispatched to a male acting erratically and running into traffic. When officers attempted to contact the suspect he was uncooperative and made gestures of shooting the officers and then reached for his backpack. Officer deployed his taser, which was not effective and second officer was able to tackle suspect to the ground where the suspect continued to resist. Officer then administered a drive stun from the taser to the suspect's back calf and officer were able to control the suspect until other officers arrived to assist in taking the suspect into custody.
