All attendees will be age verified by Citadel Security personelupon enterance to the deck. All attendees 21+ will be wristbanded. Trained event staff serving beer will be checking to be sure that all patrons wanting a beer will be wristbanded. If service person questions age, or they don't have a wristband they will be sent back to the ID check station. Throughout the event trained staff people will be monitoring intoxication. There are two enterances/exits to this deck area. Both of which will be manned at all times by Citadel or CMU staff members. No beer will be taken in or out of the beer garden area. The whole area will be closed off to the rest of the field by fencing.

8. How will security personnel be identified?

CMU event staff will be in recognizable event staff polos. Citadel security will be in uniform.

9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?

This event will be held on the new deck at the CMU softball field. The deck is enclosed by railings and stairs that go up to the deck. Please see attached map for more information.

10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)

All patrons 21+ will be wristbanded upon entry. Only those with a wristband will be served. All ID's will be checked at the door. It is unexpected, but if someone who is underage is wanting to be in this area they will be marked with X's on both hands.

11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom?

Intoxication will be monitored by trained Sodexo service staff as well as TIPs tained event staff.

12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages?

Two of our staff members have been trained through City of GJ safe server training. Other event staff will plan on attending a training before the events they staff.







SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT QUESTIONNAIRE AND AFFIDAVIT

1. Name of Event: 2019 Grand Junction Off Road & Downtown Music Festival Beer Garden

2. How many attendees are expected at the event? 10,000

3. Has the event been held in the past? If so, how many years? This will be HSR's 3rd year for beer gard.

4. Have there ever been any violations or citations issued during the event in the past? Upon a random inspection last year (2018), GJ Police officers noticed outside beer being consumed at the event. A citation was not issued to the persons consuming the outside beer.

Describe the premises at which the event will take place.
Downtown Grand Junction on Main Street between 3rd and 7th Streets.

6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified? Two types of security will be used at the event. One group will monitor all entry/exit points. Citadel Security Company, or another professional security company, will patrol the entire area of the beer garden.

7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary) See the attached layout showing the extent of the beer garden including entry/exit points. All entry/exit points will be monitored to ensure no alcoholic beverages leave the premises. Professional security guards will patrol the entire event area and have radio access to 911 dispatch should police presence be necessary.

8. How will security personnel be identified?

Professional security personnel will be in uniform. Entry/exit monitors will wear vests.

9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?

Temporary pedestrian fencing will be used to secure the perimeter of the beer garden. Temporary

construction fencing may also be used as needed. Signs will be posted stating that no alcohol is allowed beyond the beer garden boundary.

10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)

All persons interested in purchasing alcoholic beverages will be asked for government-issued identification

if they appear to be under the age of 50. The use of wrist bands will identify those individuals who are of legal age to consume alcoholic beverages.

11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom?

All volunteers and security staff will be responsible for identifying the signs of intoxication including, slurred

speach, lack of coordination, dizziness, loss of balance, loud speech/yelling, tripping, falling, etc.

12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages?

Yes, many of our member volunteers have had liquor server training by the City of Grand Junction.

13. What types of alternate beverages and food/snacks will be available?

There will be multiple food vendors along Main Street selling food and non-alcoholic beverages.

Local restaurants and business will be open during most of the event, also.

Please be advised that on May 19th, 2018 the City of Grand Junction Police Department completed a special event alcohol inspection at the 2018 GJ Music Festival Beer Garden. During the inspection, law enforcement observed alcohol inside the beer garden that was not purchased at the event.

Please find this letter as a courtesy reminder that allowing alcohol to be possessed and/or consumed on the licensed premises that is not purchased at the event is a violation of Colorado Revised Statutes Section 12-47-901(1)(h) which specifically states "it is unlawful for any person to consume malt, vinous, or spirituous liquor at any time on such premises other than such alcohol beverage as is purchased from such establishment...."
