WHEREAS, four hundred years ago, on May 11, 1607, a small group of English colonists who had traveled across the Atlantic Ocean, set foot on the banks of the James River into a new and uncharted world; and
WHEREAS, these strong and determined people were hard workers, carving a fort out of the forest in nineteen days to establish the first permanent English settlement in North America; and
WHEREAS, we commemorate the 400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Jamestown and honor those colonists, whose strength, courage, and endurance were a toehold upon this continent and
