PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, More than 5 million Americans are now living with Alzheimer's disease; and
- WHEREAS, 10 million baby boomers will develop Alzheimer's disease in their lifetime unless we find better treatments and a cure; and
- WHEREAS, There are currently 72,000 people in Colorado living with Alzheimer's and that number is expected to increase 140,000 by 2025; and
- WHEREAS, 26% of the population of Mesa County is age 55 or older, and thus at increased risk of developing dementia; and
- WHEREAS, Early detection is critical to qualify for clinical trials and in order to receive treatment medications and support from the Alzheimer's Association; and
- WHEREAS, More research is needed in order to better understand Alzheimer's and develop new ways to accurately diagnose and treat Alzheimer's; and
- WHEREAS, The local Alzheimer's Association office provides local families with counseling, education, support and a 24-hour Helpline – all free of charge to persons with the disease and their caregivers, families, and medical professionals; and
- WHEREAS, The Alzheimer's Association is also working to raise awareness and money to support research and treatments, and ultimately to find a cure.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bruce Hill, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, do hereby proclaim November 2009, as

"Alzheimer's Awareness Month"

in the City of Grand Junction and encourage all citizens to become aware of the need for awareness in the community.
