- WHEREAS, working smoke alarms on every level, a home fire escape plan and regular drills are essential for every household in Grand Junction; and
- WHEREAS, Grand Junction is joining the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) in teaching lifesaving messages in conjunction with Fire Prevention Week; and
- WHEREAS, the Fire Prevention Week 2007 theme, "Practice Your Escape Plan", is an important reminder for all citizens of Grand Junction.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doody, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, do hereby proclaim the week of October 7 through October 13, 2007, as

"FIRE PREVENTION WEEK"

in the City of Grand Junction. This week is commemorated across North America and supported by the public safety efforts of fire departments, schools and other safety advocates, in conjunction with the NFPA; and

The City Council, on behalf of the Grand Junction Fire Department, takes this opportunity tell all citizens that most fire deaths occur in the home because we are most vulnerable where we sleep. When the smoke alarm sounds, you and your family have only one or two minutes to easily escape. Statistics indicate only one out of four American families have planned and practiced their home escape plan.
