## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, as a country, we often deny growing old, and are consumed

with living better, longer and maybe forever; and

WHEREAS, heightening awareness in the 18-30 year old age group around the need for young people to create advance medical

directives; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that only about 20 percent of people in

Colorado have executed an advance directive. Moreover, it

is estimated that less than 50 percent of severely or terminally ill patients have an advance directive; and

WHEREAS, it is likely that a significant reason for these low percentages

is that there is both a lack of knowledge and considerable

confusion in the public about Advance Directives; and

WHEREAS, one of the principal goals of Healthcare Decisions Day is to

encourage medical professionals and lawyers to volunteer their time and efforts to improve public knowledge and increase the number of Mesa County citizens with advance

directives; and

WHEREAS, communicating end-of-life wishes involves introducing the

conversation, exploring personal beliefs and choices, and

defining and documenting these wishes; and

WHEREAS, the Advance Care Planning Task Force and other

organizations throughout Mesa County / Colorado have endorsed this event and are committed to educating the public about the importance of discussing health care

choices and executing advance directives.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tom Kenyon, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, do hereby proclaim April 16, 2012

as

## "NATIONAL HEALTH CARE DECISIONS DAY"

in the City of Grand Junction and urge all citizens to make their health care wishes known to assure that their personal beliefs and preferences will be honored during a time of medical crisis.
