Item 2: Approval of Minutes

Scott Coleman moved to approve the November 8, 2012 Parks and Recreation Advisory Board minutes. Dr. Scott McBrayer seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Item 3: TABOR Open House

Rob Schoeber discussed the TABOR Open House that is scheduled for this evening at Two Rivers Convention Center. There are a wide variety of projects that could benefit, should the community ever decide to let the City retain tax revenues above what is allowed under the Taxpayers' Bill of Rights (TABOR). The open house will host a number of booths (transportation, fire stations, trails, parks, etc.), providing an opportunity for the citizens to make comments. The City's goal is to get the information distributed in preparation for a future vote, should the economy continue to do well. The TABOR information is currently being distributed to the public through utility bills, articles in the Daily Sentinel, and etc.

Item 4: Lincoln Park Update

The removal of the old Lincoln Park playground is scheduled to begin on Monday and the Christian Community School, who is receiving the playground, will be assisting with the tear down. The hard core areas of the new playground have been prepped already and are ready to go. City staff intends to use real trees for some of the new boarders and benches. The removal of the loop road is almost complete, and the arboretum trail is in place and ready for the concrete to be poured. Traci Wieland briefly discussed a couple

of changes and additions to the original plan, including Grand Valley Transportation's new pullout. Staffs also recently met with the tennis community and have redesigned the tennis court area, which has opened up additional space for parking. The goal while renovating the park is to meet, and hopefully exceed, the ADA guidelines throughout the park. Discussion ensued regarding the potential relocation of the World War I Veteran's memorial flag pole, with the Board deciding to discuss appropriate locations at the January meeting. Discussions are still taking place regarding the relocation of the horseshoe pits. At this time, the County is willing to provide the group with six courts at the fairgrounds location.

Marc Litzen expressed how lucky the City is to have such enthusiastic and passionate staff working on these types of projects, stating it is "refreshing". Dave McIlnay agreed, stating the Parks and Recreation staff is the primary reason he enjoys serving as a PRAB member. Scott Coleman also stated he enjoys working with the staff and looks forward to the meetings because of the "can do" attitude. Traci Wieland thanked the Board for their gracious comments and stated she would pass along the recognition to the Lincoln Park committee members.

Item 5: Staff Update

City Council approved the 2013 budget at last night's Council meeting, which included allocations towards the Matchett Park and Las Colonias Park master plans. Due to the large undertaking of the master plans and renovation projects, management has been reviewing the best way to handle the growing workload, deciding to make several changes: 1) Traci Wieland will be serving as Project Manager for the next two years. Her title will remain the same, yet she will be spending approximately 80% of her time working on park projects and will be distributing her duties to several other staff members. 2) Eddie Mort's position has been re-evaluated, and he will now be assuming oversight for Lincoln Park as a whole (park, shelters, barn, stadium, etc. – everything except the golf course). His remaining responsibilities including weed abatement, Canyon View Park, etc. are being shuffled to the other Park Supervisors. City Council approved for an additional full time position at the stadium, which will also help with the increased work load at Lincoln Park. 3) The Leisure Service Representatives will begin rotating to the Parks Administration office for cross-training, in order to replace Senior Administrative Assistant Jessica Dennison during her one year of absence for maternity leave. Seasonal employees will be hired to backfill at the Parks and Recreation Administration office as needed. The Board members discussed the potential use of volunteers to help with the increased workloads, with the suggestion to pursue a possible agreement with CMU to use students who are working towards credits.

Item 6: Project Updates

Mike Vendegna distributed and reviewed the monthly projects update (See attached). Traci Wieland briefly discussed the Las Colonias master plan, stating staff is still moving forward with the backwater area concept, has received DOE's approval, and are meeting with the Army Core of Engineers. At this time, Colorado Fish and Wildlife have some concerns regarding the ammonia levels.

An ADA expert from Colorado Springs recently came out to evaluate the aquatics locker rooms, and reported a much worse evaluation than anticipated. The recommendation was for the pools to hire an architect and start completely over with the design build process. Currently, nearly every locker room amenity at both pools is not meeting ADA guidelines.

Rob Schoeber proudly announced that Eddie Mort has been awarded the Rocky Mountain Turf Growers Outstanding Stadium Professional of the Year. Congratulations Eddie!

Item 7: For the Good of the Community

Discussion ensued regarding the need for parking restrictions during the downtown Parade of Lights. The Board members discussed many safety concerns they had witnessed during this year's event. Rob Schoeber stated the Downtown Development Authority intends to address the issue for future parades and events.

Item 8: Adjourn
