## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS,

on February 19, 1913, Reverend K.G. William Dahl and fifty-four charter members founded the Bethphage Inner Mission Association to establish a place outside of Axtell, Nebraska as a Christian community for people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS,

on October 20, 1925, Reverends Julius Moehl, August Hoeger, and William Fruehling, and laymen John Aden and William Ehmen proposed turning the deserted Martin Luther Academy in Sterling, Nebraska into a school for children with disabilities forming the Martin Luther Home Society; and

WHEREAS,

their shared mission, vision, and Church affiliation prompted the two organizations' Boards of Directors to merge the two ministries to become Mosaic, a move that became complete July 1, 2003; and

WHEREAS,

to recognize the dedication and vital role of Mosaic in enhancing the lives of individuals with disabilities in the United States and beyond, for a century and many years to come; and

WHEREAS,

the day of February 19, 2013, has been designated as "Mosaic Day" in order to celebrate and recognize the 100 year anniversary of the mission to create a life of possibilities for people with intellectual disabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, Bill Pitts, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, does hereby proclaim February 19, 2013 as

## "MOSAIC DAY"

in the City of Grand Junction, and call upon the citizens of Grand Junction to observe this day with appropriate programs and activities. Furthermore, I encourage the citizens of Colorado to seek information from Mosaic in matters concerning a life of possibilities for people with intellectual disabilities.
