This is a follow up discussion from Council's Retreat related to the Transportation Capacity Payment (TCP). The specific issue is the increase of the base rate for non-residential used to equal the base rate for residential used (from \$1,589 to \$2,554).

Background, Analysis and Options:

The City requires new development to pay a Transportation Capacity Payment (TCP) to help defray the cost to the City for the impact of development on City Streets. In 2008 the City Council increased the TCP base rate for residential uses to \$2,554 but did not increase the non-residential base rate which remains at \$1,589. At the January 11, 2013 Retreat, Council directed staff to develop additional data and options to increase the non-residential base rate to \$2,554.
